Polling locations tend to be busy before work (6:30am-8:30am), around lunch (11:00am-1:00pm), and after work (5:00pm-7:30pm, when polls close). Early voting at the Franklin County BOE starts off slow for the first two weeks, gets busier the third week, and the final week before Election Day is very busy. Weekends are busier than weekdays but follow the same trend.

Deadline to request an absentee ballot: Saturday, October 31st If mailed, absentee ballots must be postmarked by the day before the election to be counted.
